In 1775, Grey Grove's Company, like most companies in The 23rd Regiment, had one captain, two lieutenants, two serjeants, four corporals, and 40-50 enlisted men in a company.

The use of the term "vacant" on the above Company Muster Roll indicates that in 1775 those positions existed and, if Grey Grove's Company of today grows sufficiently, we will need to add those positions.

    Because it is expected that the 2nd Platoon will grow sufficiently to, again, become its own company, it is especially important for 2nd Platoon to recruit and develop its own leadership.
