Old Sturbridge Village

August 1-2. This is a wonderful site just over the Massachusetts border about 2 1/2 hours' drive from New York/Westchester. An early American town on rolling hills with great farm lands around it for maneuvering and fighting. It's invitation only and we've had great fun there in prior years.

Beyond the site itself there are a lot of tourists here. This is a major draw for the

site and there is a great opportunity to talk to the public and help educate them.

You will need at least 2 full boxes of ammo for this event, more couldn't hurt as last year we had two full battles and a skirmish

Ken Siegel is generously providing a number of hotel rooms for those who do not want to tent it and at this time there are still a couple open but he needs to be contacted beforehand if you plan to use them.

To reach the site from New York take either I-95 or the Hutchinson River Parkway E to **I-91 North**. Follow this to I15 via exit 29 follow this to **I-84 E** in Hartford. Follow this for 36 miles. Take **exit 2 to MA131**, keep left onto River rd then right onto Shattack rd. follow this 2/10's of a mile to Old Sturbridge village rd into the park.

Boones Homestead

The second event in august is at Daniel Boones Homestead the weekend of August 14-16. You will need at least two boxes of ammo for this event, three would be better as the plan for the weekend is for a skirmish and two battles.

A pig roast is planned for Saturday dinner. They've used this vendor before and it was very good.

This is great site with many good memories for the RWF with rolling hillsides, great open fields and period farm dwellings. It is also, if you know the region, only a little bit further on than Hope Lodge.

To reach the site take the Jersey turnpike south to exit 6 for the **Pennsylvania Turnpike**. Follow this about 30 miles to the **King of Prussia** exit. As you get off stay will to the right. Just past the toll booth you want to get on to **422W**. Follow this about 30 miles, to a right turn onto **Daniel Boone rd**. Follow this for a little over half a mile. The site is on the left. Yes these are not the official directions but trust me on this. This is part of my daily commute and 422W is a much better way to go.

Fort Ticonderoga.

The weekend of Sept 12-13 this is the event of the year. The one British Brigade and THE one event to make if you can't make any others. This will be Major Morgan's last outing as an officer of the RWFiA and formally passing the baton to Major Riley. It's been a while since we've been up there in a Brigade event and we've yet to see the new Montcalm monument.

Germantown

Saturday October 3. Familiar fall battle. It use to clash with the burning of Kingston New York which divided people's sentiments. The New York event has now been moved off to be 2 weeks later removing this clash and leaving us to only clash with the colonials, whom we get to beat, twice.
