- Celtic Fest
 - Description: This is the 23^{ed}'s first time attending this event. My intent is to test it out to see if it is worthwhile for recruiting and building our strength in Pennsylvania. I volunteered to give talks on both Saturday (40 minutes) and Sunday (30 minutes). Saturday's talk focuses on the British war effort at both the strategic and operational levels. Sunday's discussion centers on the regiment including: formation, organization, tactics, officers, and the individual soldier.

- Uniform: Early war, bring later war articles with you. No ammunition required.
- ✤ Battle of Germantown
 - Description: This is the annual powder burner held at the Chew House. This should be a fun one and one not to be missed with Lt. Gen. Riley in attendance. This Colour ceremony will take place at 1:00. Pack two boxes of ammunition, one for each battle.

 - Uniform: Early war kit, two boxes of ammunition.
- ✤ Mount Harmon Plantation
 - Description: The British Brigade is doing a lot to make this a worthwhile event for participants. New redoubts are complete and trenches are dug. Brigadier McGaughey sent a note out to unit commanders about providing guard posts and pickets. The idea is to assign unit/units an area to guard on Saturday, which the Continentals, may or may not probe. This will take place beginning at 1100 on Saturday and run to 1430, just before the afternoon battle. I personally think this is great opportunity for our NCOs to exercise command and lead troops. I would like to have a small mess ceremony in camp on Saturday evening to help build camaraderie. There will be a lot going on at this event and is not one to miss!

Eric Spaar is brining his dining fly, cooking wares, and food. The cost is \$10 for the meals for the weekend.
