

The Fusilier October/November 2017

Gentlemen,

The 23rd supported a number of autumn events as the 2017 campaign season draws to a close. There were two significant events off the field in October as both Justin Parker, Grenadier Company and Dan Blandon, Light Infantry Company married their beautiful brides. Please congratulate these gents when you see them.

The Colour Event at Sandy Hollow in September proved to be a significant, fun and warm event. Lt. Gen. Riley joined us for the event and we held a ceremony to recognize him as the Colonel of the Regiment. I presented him with the Commander's Sword as the first badge of his office. The General was honoured and excited to lead the RWFIA. He hopes to travel to the US annually to attend an event. We are very fortunate to have such an enthusiastic, knowledgeable and experienced Colonel to aid us in strengthening our bond with the Royal Welsh. I also thanked Brigadier Vivian for his years of dedication and support to the 23rd.

The site of the event consisted of an open township park with a gently rolling slope and a private horse pasture, just beyond Birmingham Meeting House, separated by a wooded lot. I served as commander of the 2nd Battalion, Crown Forces and Lieut. Jack Pritchard led the 23rd on the field, with Sjt. Maj. Astle as his second in command. Sjt. Maj. Raby served as the 2nd Battalion Serjeant Major. Saturday's scenario directed that Crown units advance from the park, through the woods and assemble at the far end of the horse pasture. Once in the assembly area, Crown Forces fought the rebels across the pasture and through the woods. The full battle line assembled in the park and in front of the spectators. The 1st Battalion, under Maj. Malcom MacWilliam (42nd Grenadiers) formed on the left and the 2nd Battalion on the right. The Regulars pushed and exerted constant pressure on the rebel line using a combination of volley firing and advancing. One final push against the rebels forced them up the rise at the end of park, routing the defeated irregulars off the field. Sunday's battle plan directed that the Crown units assemble the wood line, push out rebel skirmishers and assemble in the main battle area of the park. I led the left wing of the line and Capt. Jeff Blessing (17th Regiment of Foot) commanded 1st Battalion on the right. Sunday's scenario played out very similar to Saturday's, except that once the rebels ascended the slope, Crown troops did not pursue. The rebels, although bloodied remained on the field. The 23rd did a great job under Lieut. Pritchards's command. Special thanks to: Maj. Ken Siegel, Lieut. Jack Pritchard, RSM Paul Astle, RSM Steve Raby, RDM Joseph Siegel, GV David Leslie-Hughes, Cpl. Cpl. Justin Parker had his first independent command at the Germantown event on October 7th. He led a contingent of the 23rd including: GV David Leslie-Hughes, Pvt. Kyle Parker and Rct. Mike Boyle in defence of the Chew Mansion. Congrats on the great work Justin!

The first weekend of November included events at both Hope Lodge, PA on November 4th and Camden, SC on November 5th. RSM Paul Astle led the 23rd contingent at Hope Lodge including: GV David Leslie-Hughes and Cpl. Gregory Urwin. GV Eric Spaar is leading the Fusiliers at Camden. I hope to add the event after action reports to the next edition of the Fusilier.

Each Fusilier is expected to help fund the Regimental treasury through the payment of Regimental dues of \$20.00; which does not include Company Fees. An addition fee of \$25.00 is required for membership in the Brigade of the American Revolution.
