Mount Harmon After Action Report

Capt. Horsefall's Company participated in a BB event at Mount Vernon on May 4th. Participants included GV Eric Spaar, Sjt. Ben Beers, L/Cpl. Alex Ivanchishin, and recruits Eric Marqueling, Kevin McClain, Tim, and Jez Brieaddy.

The 23rd served in the 3rd Company under the command of Major Loane, brigaded with HM 43rd Regt. of Foot, the 1^{sd} New Jersey Volunteers, and Regiment von Hyun. The event featured two short (no more than 45 minutes apiece) scenarios, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon. The 3rd Company arrived during the morning's fight after the 1^{sd} and 2rd Companies became decisively engaged. The Fusiliers advanced in open order, delivering crisp volleys and driving the rebel center in and off the field. The afternoon battle developed in a similar manner and the 3rd Company formed the left side of the Crown line. After pouring heavy fire into the rebel right, the company fixed bayonets and drove the enemy remnants from the field. Overall the event was a great success for His Majesty's Arms and the 23rd, including those witnessing battle for a first time, played an integral role in both victories. Storms and rain arrived during Saturday night and continued into Sunday, sparing the rebels further humiliation.
