Old Bethpage Village Restoration After Action Report

Men from the Flank Companies participated in a scenario-based event at Old Bethpage Village in Nassau County, New York. Participants included:

OBVR is a collection of late 18th Century and early 19th Century structures gathered from throughout Long Island and fashioned together into a village. The general scenario was based on the British occupation of Long Island during the war. Patrols scoured the towns requesting passes and loyalty oaths from villagers and visitors. Men from the 23rd were joined by grenadiers from the 35th and a pair of dragoons from the 17th. Saturday morning, we arrested one of the townfolk, requisitioned his house, and tied him to a tree in the name of King and Country. Around lunchtime, a patrol encountered rebels from the

local Huntington militia, which were reluctantly driven off after a brisk fight through town. The rebels once more reappeared later that afternoon and after exchanging volleys were put to flight after the cold steel of the Regulars appeared.

Sunday morning followed the same pattern, except the 23rd placed those suspected of nefarious activity into a local stockade. The resurgent rebels appeared again on Sunday afternoon, forcing the Regulars to use the stockade as a defensive structure. The amateurs pushed the initial force into the fort, but failed to press their advantage and burned their powder. The Crown troops reassembled outside of the fort, fired a couple of brisk volleys, fixed bayonets, and one more drove the rebels off, securing the town.

OBVR is a fantastic site in the shadow of New York City. Our hosts, the Huntington Militia were more the accommodating. It was the first time in my 30 years with the 23rd that a campsite was set up for us. The site provided delicious, campfire-cooked meals on Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon. Cpl. Justin Parker did an excellent job of coordinating with the site and establishing event logistical support. The Fusiliers did an excellent job of firing and maneuvering, resembling experienced, veteran troops.

The site plans to host events every two years. Mark your 2021 calendars now for the next Old Bethpage Village event!

Reenlistment for the Conflict in America

One of His Majesty's most distinguished Regiments is offering you the opportunity to obtain honour and glory known only to the 23^{rd} through noble service in the present conflict. The term of this contract is for one year and encompasses supporting Army and Regimental operations throughout the troublesome 13 Colonies.

Each Fusilier is expected to help fund the Regimental treasury through the payment of Regimental dues of \$20.00; which does not include Company Fees. An addition fee of \$25.00 is required for membership in the Brigade of the American Revolution.
