March 11 & 12 - Battle of Guilford Courthouse, Greensboro, NC & St. David's Day Dinner (Saturday 11 March) – What can we say about Guilford Courthouse – probably the best turnout (16 in attendance) and weekend we've had as a unit. #### Message from Commander of the British Brigade, Jim McGaughey

RE: Mt Vernon Arrival and Encampment

Attached, please find a map for arrival on Friday and Saturday. Please share this with your unit members so that have an idea where to go upon arrival.

All cars out of camp Saturday morning by 0845. Cars may come in during the evening, but only if loading out. Absolutely no cars in camp overnight.

If staying on site for the weekend, you will be directed to the larger parking lot after you unload.

If day tripping, you will be directed to come in through the Hearst Gate, at the end of the public parking lot, just off the round-about circle on the right. Identify yourself to security as a participant.





The registration table will be at the entrance to the camp for all. You will find your registration packets there that will include discounts, site information, etc. Discounts will be available in the gift shops, food court, and outside food vendor.

As usual, the site will stay open later Saturday evening so that re-enactors may take buildings tours and visit the museum. No weapons in the home of His Excellency, please. The free pass for tours also applies to the Grist Mill and Distillery down the road. Worth a visit.

I will be putting out an army schedule in the coming days that you may share with your members as well.

Matt West, of the 84th RHE, will be my second.

Bill Johnson will be DQMG for the event, ably assisted by Ray Helge, and Pat Updike.

Ice, wood, and straw are available on site. If any are out, please notify Matt, Bill, or myself. More of what is needed will be delivered.

The coming information will contain an army schedule, along with company assignments and company officers.

For those that haven't been, this is a huge public event. It is not unusual for them to get 14,000 more over the two days. It should be noted that a few years back, Tom Cruise and Dan Snyder (owner of the Washington Commanders) came to see us. You never know who will be there.

As usual, the wedge area will be filled in upon arrivals. We do not reserve spots for tents, as often they don't show up and we want to avoid a ragged appearance.

For those campaigner camping (no tents), please check with Bill first, but I believe that area under the trees at the entrance of the camp worked out well last year. No brush for huts is available, given the time of year.
